

Parai is sometimes associated with a negative stigma. The traditional players, known as "Paraiyars" in Tamil and "pariah" in English, were considered outcasts at the bottom of the caste hierarchy. Despite the abolishment of untouchability, some societal prejudice remains. To challenge this stigma, the Dandanakka Kalai Kuzhu, a group of amateur folk artists, learn and perform Parai in their community. They aim to reclaim and celebrate the instrument's cultural value, believing that music transcends boundaries and unites people


